

Jovan Aleksić – Short Biography

Dr. Jovan Aleksić, Assistant Professor. He was born on October 11, 1988, in Kosovska Mitrovica. He received his primary and secondary education in his hometown. He completed his undergraduate and master's academic studies in history at the Faculty of Philosophy of the University of Priština with temporary seat in Kosovska Mitrovica, where in 2022 he also earned his doctoral degree by defending his dissertation titled "*Life and Work of Milorad Ekmečić (1928–2015)*". He has presented his papers and reports at 25 academic conferences and has published 35 scholarly works in relevant domestic and international journals and conference proceedings. Since 2018, he has been employed as a teaching assistant at the Department of History of the Faculty of Philosophy of the University of Priština with temporary seat in Kosovska Mitrovica, and in September 2022 he was elected to the position of assistant professor. He teaches undergraduate and master's courses in the subjects of historical methodology, teaching methodology and contemporary history. He is also engaged at the Faculty of International Politics and Security of the "Union – Nikola Tesla" University, where he teaches courses related to the contemporary history of Serbia and modern European history. He was a member of the Commission responsible for the preparation of accreditation materials for undergraduate, master's, and doctoral study programs at the Department of History of the Faculty of Philosophy in Kosovska Mitrovica. He has reviewed papers for several academic journals (*Zbornik radova Filozofskog fakulteta (Proceedings of the Faculty of Philosophy of the University of Priština)*, *Baština (Heritage)*, *Srpska Baština (Serbian heritage)*, *Pirotski zbornik (Pirot Proceedings)*). He is the president of the Trade Union Organization of the Faculty of Philosophy in Kosovska Mitrovica. He is a member of the Faculty's Election Council and a member of the Serbian Historical Society. He is the recipient of several awards and recognitions.
